On the seventh day of February 1870, Councillors Wright Langford and Grimes only being present, the regular session of the Municipal Council of Hull for the month of February 1870 was upon motion of councillor Wright seconded by councillor Langford adjourned to the eleventh day of February 1870.

At a general session of the municipal council of the townships of Hull held at Chelsea on the eleventh day of February 1870 being an adjourned general session of the said municipal Council from the seventh day of February 1870, of which due notice was given to each of the Municipal Councillors of the said townships of Hull, at which were present Councillors Philemon Wright Michael Grimes Richard Langford and Thomas M. Gay Esquire Mayor forming a quorum of the said municipal Council, the said Thomas M. Gay presiding: Councillor Michael Grimes took the oath of office.

It was and is unanimously resolved and declared

Upon motion of Councillor Wright seconded by Councillor Grimes -

Whereas in the current count for the district of Ottawa, a certain suit



or action No 435 - the Corporation of the Township  
of Hull in the County and District of Ottawa  
a body corporate and politic plaintiff against  
John Byler of the said Township of Hull

instituted in the name and on behalf of  
the Corporation of the Township of Hull against

of the village of Bytown in the District of Ottawa

of advocates barristers and attorneys in partnership  
under the name style and firm of Fleming  
Church & Kenny as the attorneys of the said  
Corporation of the Township of Hull, - which  
said suit has been served upon the said  
John Byler and returned into court and  
is pending -

That the institution of the said  
suit against the said John Byler has  
never been and is not authorized by  
the Corporation of the Township of Hull  
or by any person body or municipal  
Council qualified to act for the said  
Corporation; and that Messrs Fleming  
Church & Kenny have never been counselled  
or retained, and have never been and are  
not employed by the Corporation of the  
Township of Hull or by any person body  
or municipal Council authorized to  
act for the said Corporation, as the  
attorneys of the said Corporation of the  
Township of Hull to institute the said suit  
or to take any proceedings in law whatever

on behalf or in the name of the said Corporation  
of the township of Hull against the said  
John Leyton

And that the said Corporation  
of the township of Hull did and doth  
heavily disavow the said suit or action  
and all and each of the proceedings  
had and taken therein in the name and  
on behalf of the said Corporation  
by the aforesaid Messrs Fleming  
Church & Kenny, as the attorneys and  
did and doth heavily disavow Messrs  
Fleming Church & Kenny as the attorneys  
of the said Corporation in the said suits.

And it was and is further  
unanimously resolved and declared

That Peter Leyton of the  
village of Leyton in the district of Newark  
Esquire Advocate, hath been and is  
heavily constituted and appointed the  
attorney of the Corporation of the township  
of Hull with power, for and in the name  
of the Corporation of the township of Hull  
to make a disavowal of the said suit or  
action and of all and each of the  
proceedings had & taken therein by the  
aforesaid Messrs Fleming Church & Kenny,  
and of Messrs Fleming Church & Kenny as  
attorneys of the Corporation of the township  
of Hull in the said suit or action, and  
with power to file and furnish reasons  
or grounds of disavowal to plead  
upon that domicile and generally to  
do, for and in the name and on behalf of



the corporation of the township of Mill in and  
about the said disavowal whatever  
the code of procedure and the law  
require, and he shall deem necessary  
and to the interest of the said corporation  
in the prosecution of the said disavowal  
be done.
