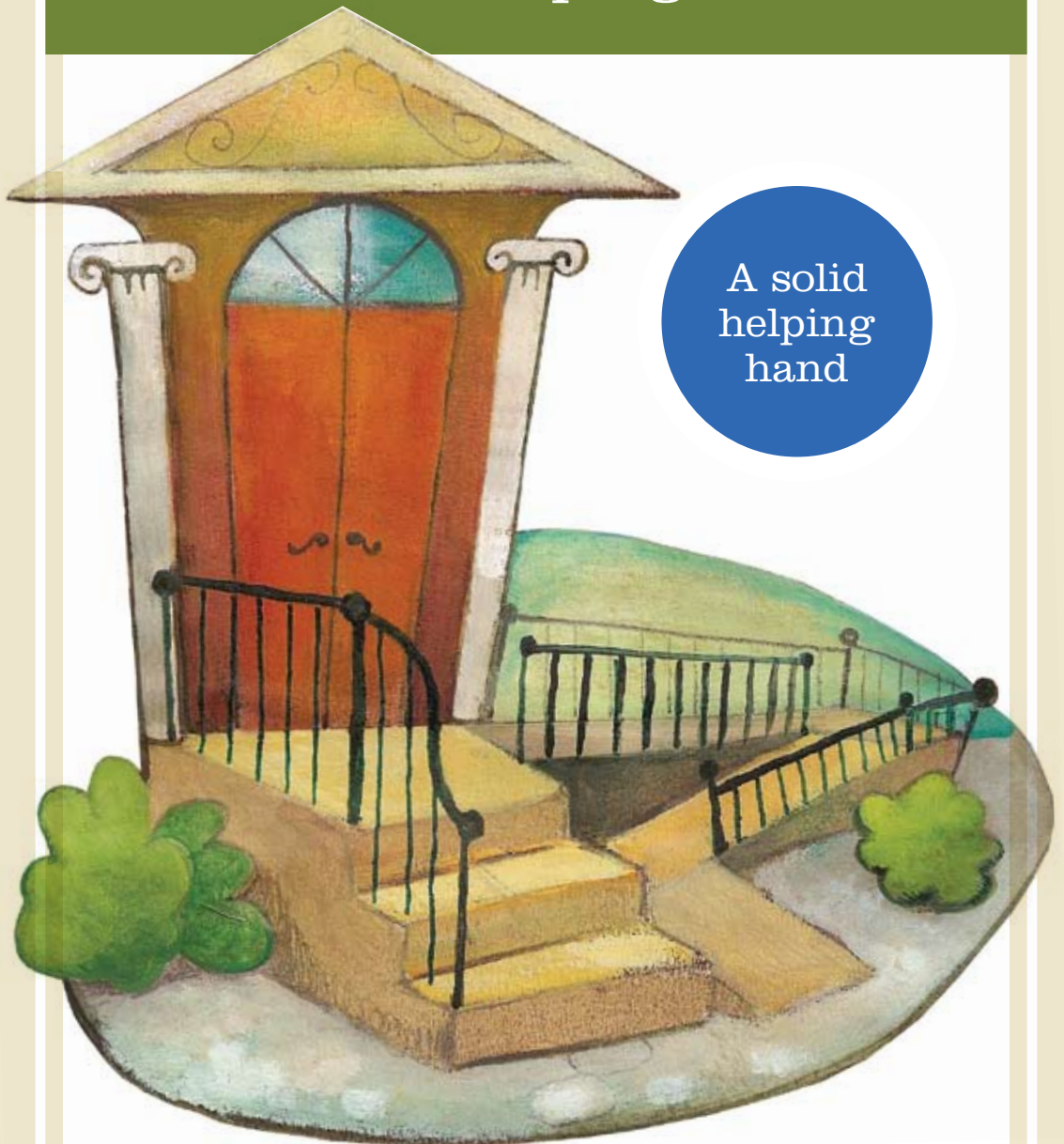


# Accessible Housing

## Residential Adaptation Assistance Program (RAAP)

**Objective** To provide financial assistance to cover the costs of adapting the homes of people with disabilities to make them more accessible.

**Who is eligible for this program?** People with disabilities, whose functional limitations affect their daily activities, regardless of their income.

## Programme Rénovation Québec (PRQ)

A residential adaptation program applicable to all residential buildings.

**Objective** To adapt a residential building or dwelling. The maximum subsidy is 65% of the total cost of the work, and cannot exceed \$10,000 per building. It should be noted that the value of the work per building must come to at least \$2,500.

**Who is eligible?** People with disabilities or reduced autonomy.

## Home Adaptation for Seniors' Independence (HASI)

**Objective** To help owners or tenants cover the cost of making minor adaptations to a dwelling.

These adaptations must be permanently integrated into the dwelling. They can include things like improving access to a dwelling, or the use of a kitchen or bathroom.

**Who is eligible?** Individuals aged 65 or over.

## Tax credits – Tax deduction for access for people with reduced mobility

**Tax deductions are available to:**

- individuals who adapt their dwellings to make them accessible to people with reduced mobility; and
- owners of incorporated or registered businesses who renovate or make adjustments to improve access for clients with reduced mobility.
